Studying at Ca' Foscari

Academic calendar

At Ca' Foscari the academic year starts in September. The courses in the scientific and humanistic areas are delivered in two semesters.

First semester: September-December

Exams: January

Second semester: February-May

Exams: June

Further academic sessions: end of August - beginning of

September

The courses in the economic and management area are delivered into four periods:

First period: mid-September – mid-October

First-period exams: end of October

Second period: November – beginning of December

Second-period exams: mid-December

Winter exam session: January

Third period: February – mid-March Third-period exams: end of March

Fourth period: April – beginning of May Fourth-period exams: second half of May

Summer exam session: June

Further academic sessions: end of August – beginning of September

Grades and Study Plan

The Italian grading system works on a scale from 18 to 30.18 is the lowest passing grade (sufficiency).

30 is the highest grade. In case of particularly outstanding exams, the professor can assign the so-called "lode" and the grade is registered as 30 cum laude (30L). Only if you pass the exam you will obtain the relevant credits (CFU - Crediti Formativi Universitari). Exams usually give 6 or 12 credits. The list of courses and educational activities in the academic course of study of a student form the so-called "Study Plan". Every year students must complete their Study Plan online, in their Personal Area.

Please note: You can only register for exams included in your Study Plan.
